SECTION 1

JUDGING FOR THIS SECTION WILL BEGIN PROMPTLY AT 8:30 AM, WEDNESDAY, JULY 20th

**ALL ENTRIES, WINNING & NON-WINNING, and RIBBONS in SECTION 1
MUST BE REMOVED BETWEEN 8:00 AM and 12:00 NOON ON SUNDAY, July 31st.
EXHIBITS MAY NOT BE REMOVED BEFORE THIS TIME.**

All entries must be in standard canning jars. The label on the side must have the product name, date canned, and processing method used. Canned foods will be disqualified unless current USDA recommendations are used and jars are labeled correctly. Vegetables (except tomatoes with no added meat or vegetable) must be processed in a pressure canner at the appropriate pressure and time. Fruits (including tomatoes with no added vegetable or meat), jellies, jams, and preserves, and all pickled products (including sauerkraut) must be processed in a boiling water bath. Dried foods do not require processing. Paraffin to seal jellied fruit products and open kettle canning are no longer allowed. Jar lids and rings must be NEW. The Delaware State Fair reserves the right to permit the judges to open any jar. Judging guidelines are 40% product, 40% pack and 20% container. Items having no competition will be awarded premiums only if they are worthy in the opinion of the judges. **NO FABRIC COVERS** on the canned items.

To further stimulate the art of home food preservation, ALLTRISTA CORPORATION is offering – Home Canning Product Coupons to Adult 1st and 2nd place winners in Fruits, Vegetables, Pickled Foods and Soft Spreads and also to Youth 1st place winners in Fruits, Vegetables, Pickled Foods and Soft Spreads. In order to qualify, exhibits must be canned in either Ball or Kerr Jars and sealed with same brand two-piece vacuum caps clearly observable.

Definition of **PROFESSIONAL**: An exhibitor whose work in the field of culinary arts generates 51% or more of their annual income (i.e. currently employed Home Economics Teacher, Chef, etc.).
